ABOUT THE PROJECT

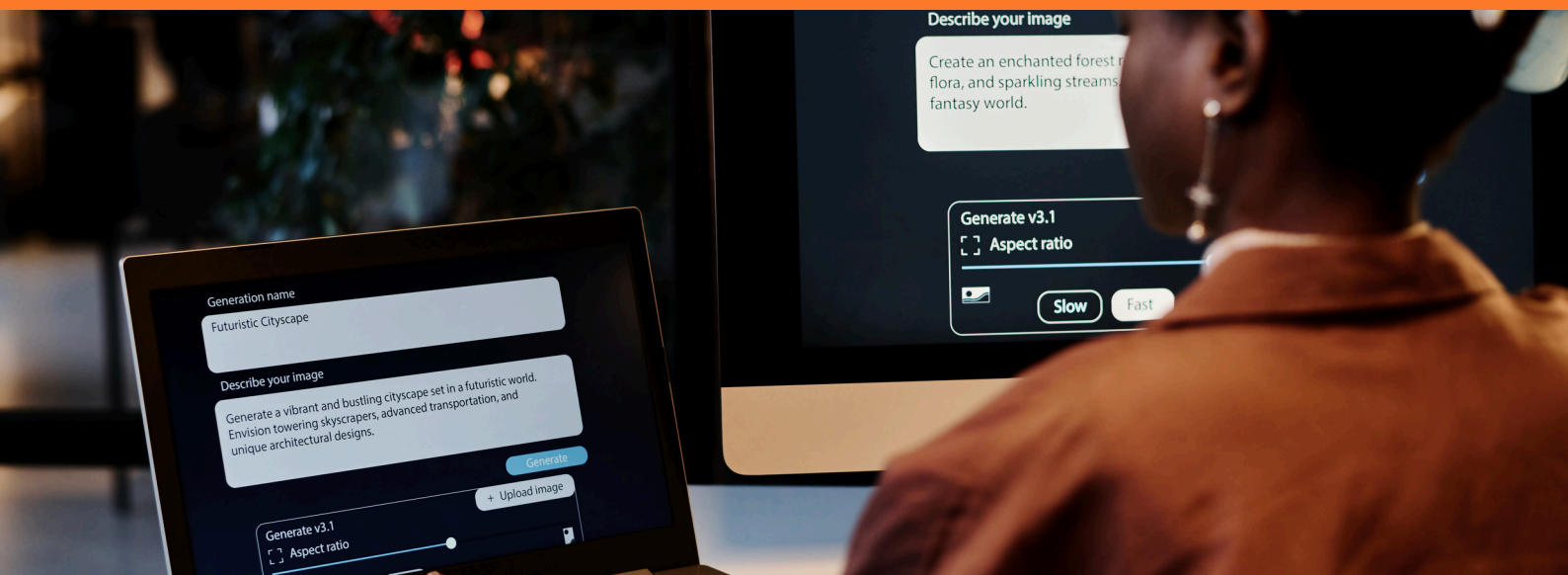

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TARGET GROUPS

- Youth workers and staff members from partner organizations who will enhance their knowledge and competencies in digital skills, intercultural understanding, and social inclusion. They will collaborate in a safe, inclusive environment that promotes innovation and awareness of EU mobility programs, fostering a stronger European identity.
- Young people aged 15-30, especially those with fewer opportunities, such as minorities, immigrants, refugees, residents of rural areas, and people with disabilities. These young people will benefit from the knowledge and skills passed on by trained youth workers.
- A broad network of stakeholders reached through dissemination activities who will be informed about the project results and use the educational in their own work, multiplying the project's impact.

RESULTS OF THE PROJECT

- Creation and distribution of the Youth Empowerment Handbook on digital literacy, intercultural understanding, and active citizenship.
- Organization of training seminars and workshops to develop digital and social skills of youth workers.
- Development and dissemination of informational materials (leaflets, newsletters, videos) to reach a wider audience.
- Development and use of digital tools and platforms to support collaboration and learning among partners and participants.
- Implementation of cultural exchange activities to share experiences between participants from partner countries.



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
