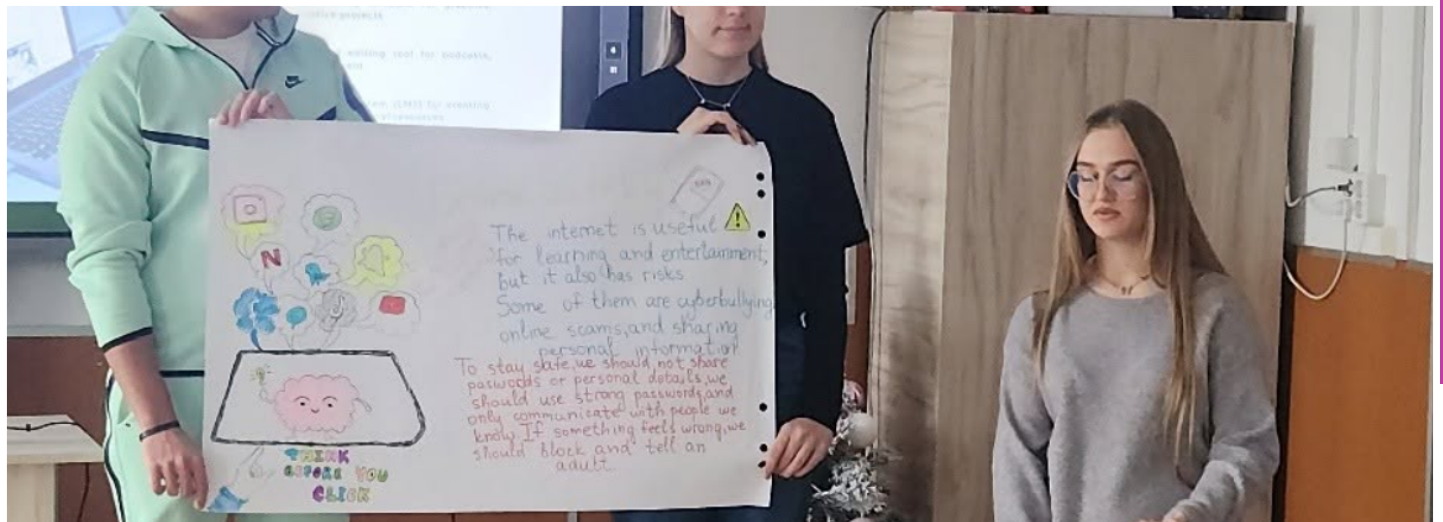

DIGI-UNITY IN ACTION: IMPLEMENTATION PHASE

The DIGI-UNITY project has successfully entered its implementation phase, transforming its vision into concrete educational actions across Europe. Following the successful Kick-off Meeting in Kozani, Greece, the partnership moved forward with the organisation of its transnational training activities, designed to strengthen youth workers' competences in digital literacy, intercultural communication, social inclusion, and active citizenship.

Through a series of educational workshops and training seminars held in Greece and Romania, participants engaged in interactive and non-formal learning experiences aimed at addressing some of the most pressing challenges faced by young people today. These activities created a valuable space for exchange, collaboration, and the development of practical skills that can be transferred directly into local youth work practices.



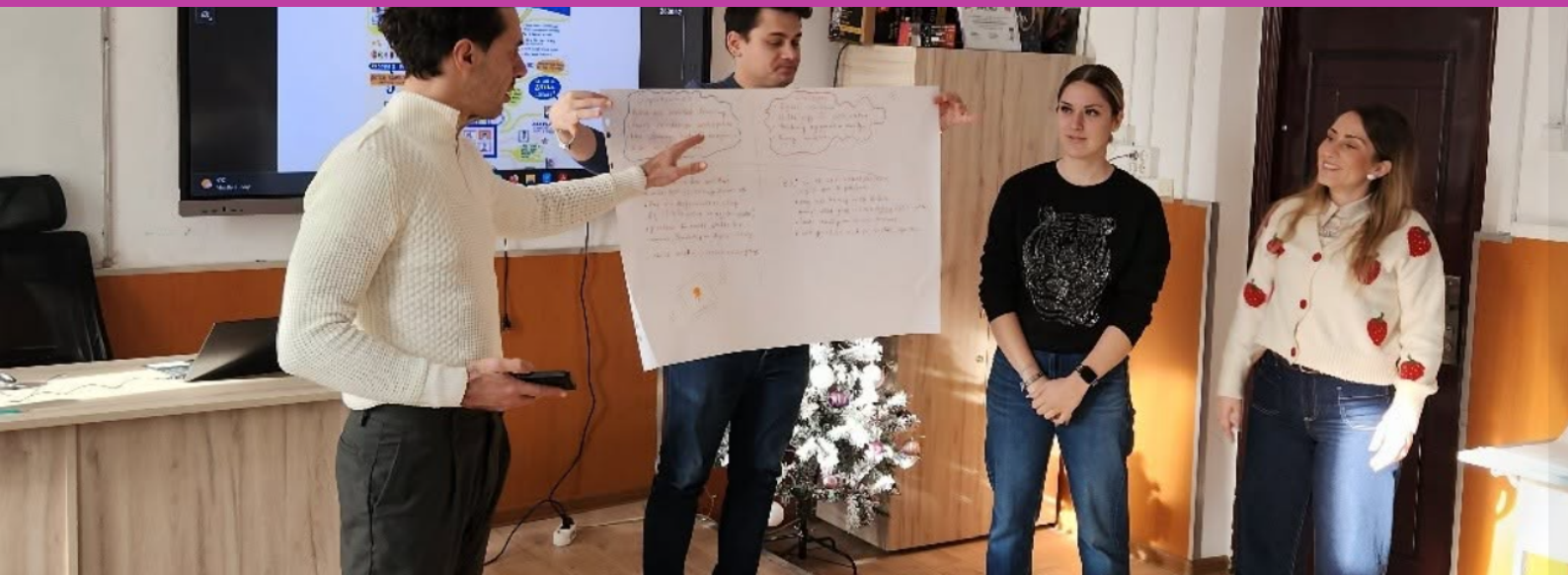

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• INTERCULTURAL COMMUNICATION WORKSHOP

The first educational workshop focused on strengthening intercultural communication skills. Participants explored cultural diversity, empathy, active listening, and strategies for effective communication in multicultural environments through interactive and non-formal learning methods.

• DIGITAL INCLUSION TRAINING SEMINAR

The second training seminar focused on the digital divide and equal access to digital opportunities. Participants examined the challenges of digital exclusion and explored innovative tools and methods to promote digital literacy and active participation among young people.

• SOCIAL INCLUSION & ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP SEMINAR

The third seminar addressed social inclusion, democratic participation, and the barriers faced by marginalised communities. Participants discussed practical solutions to promote equal opportunities, civic engagement, and stronger social cohesion.
